Vestry Briefs (from Sept. 20, 2007 Mtg)

- Jean Burton will complete the remaining 1½ years of Cindy Larned's vestry term. Another parishioner has been contacted regarding the other vacancy on the vestry.
- Bruce Phillips reported that through Aug., we are \$2,000 to the good and within \$300 of being on budget. Pledge income is down, which is usual during the summer months. Grace will be paying off the remaining balance for the stained glass window with the help of a generous donation.
- Cam Martin reported to the Finance Committee that the Sunday group meetings for stewardship went very well and that a variety of topics were discussed.
- Matthew Bailey and Pat Diamond will be working with the cemetery. Bill Corbishley has resigned from the Cemetery, as well as the Taylor Trust Fund. We thank him for his many years of service to these groups.
- Parishioner Ed Fayda was present to discuss possibilities for better illumination of our stained glass window. He suggested adding 2 more fixtures which would be located higher and replacing the wattage of existing bulbs in the current fixtures. (Metal halide has better efficiency and gets about 10,000 hours; bulbs could be changed every 4 years.) An electrical contractor's services will be needed. A mock up will be done first to see how well this plan will work.
- Jill Jensen is requesting more ongoing information for the website: pictures, articles, etc.
- Property Chair Irv Hollingsworth thanked Richard and Sandy Powell for their donation to finish keying all the outside doors. Landscaping maintenance work will be done soon on the church property (approx. \$2500).
- On October 20 the Caring Committee will host a Spaghetti Dinner where Chris Raab will give a presentation on his medical mission to Uganda.
- Vestry Retreat will be held on Sat., Oct. 13. Lisa Slinkard will help assist with Stewardship work in the first part of the day, while the afternoon will concentrate on work of the commissions and mapping out the church events calendar.

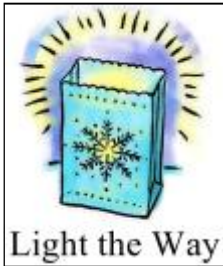

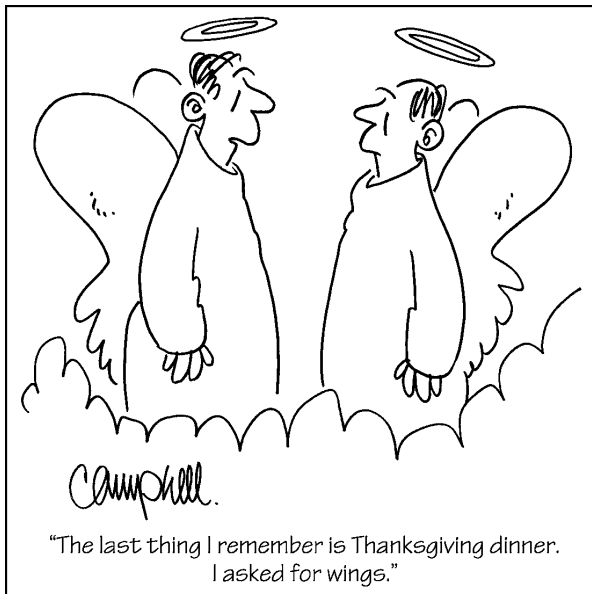

You're cordially invited to join the **Education for Ministry** program starting up in January. We meet every Monday evening at Grace from 7 - 9:30. This is a group of six to ten people in caring community to one another who study, reflect theologically, and laugh often! Pastor Anna and Cindy Larned are the group's mentors.

Education for Ministry, affectionately known as EfM, is a program of theological education-at-a-distance of the School of Theology of the University of the South. Students sign up one year at a time for this four-year program. EfM covers the basics of a theological education in the Old and New Testaments, as well as church history, liturgy, and theology. Students meet under the guidance of trained mentors. The program grants a certificate at the completion of the four years and 18 Continuing Education Units for each year's work. You will find that EfM teaches you how to think theologically, it deepens your faith and your understanding of our Christian heritage, and it provides a rare opportunity in today's world of getting to know a group of people very well. 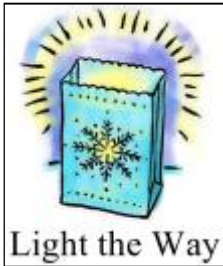

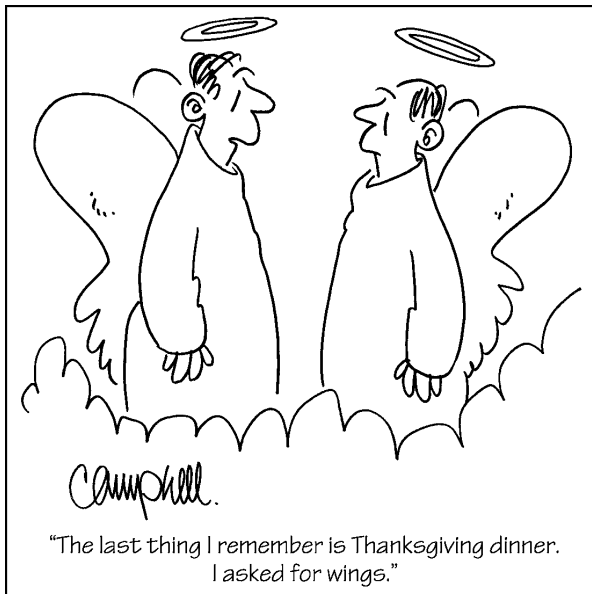
